Sadie Arnold's Honor's Excel research project is a fascinating study on "Exploring the Effects of Dance in Aphasia Rehabilitation". I was the primary mentor to Sadie from the beginning of the project. Some of my mentoring/advising responsibilities included giving Sadie feedback on: articulation of the goals of the project; project proposal and syllabus; strategies for testing subjects; progress reports and journal entries; and summative reports. I created rubrics, communicated with the Excel office, wrote evaluations, graded Sadie's work, and did CITI Social and Behavioral training leading to IRB certification. I made the purchases for test kits for her project, read and suggested articles related to her research, and met monthly in-person to visit project successes and well as areas to strengthen.
